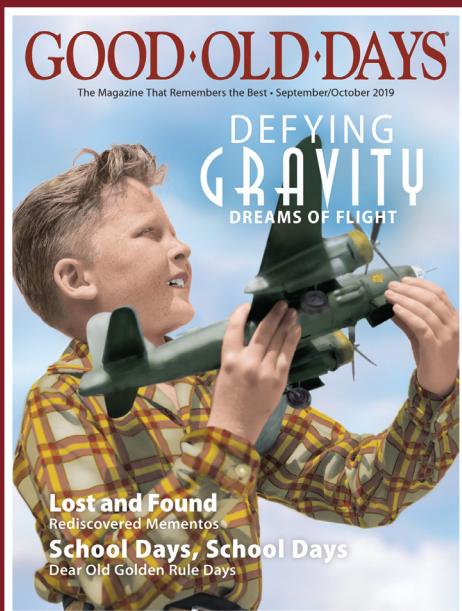

Picture This: Readers may submit a single nostalgic photograph with a short, descriptive caption that takes us back in time.

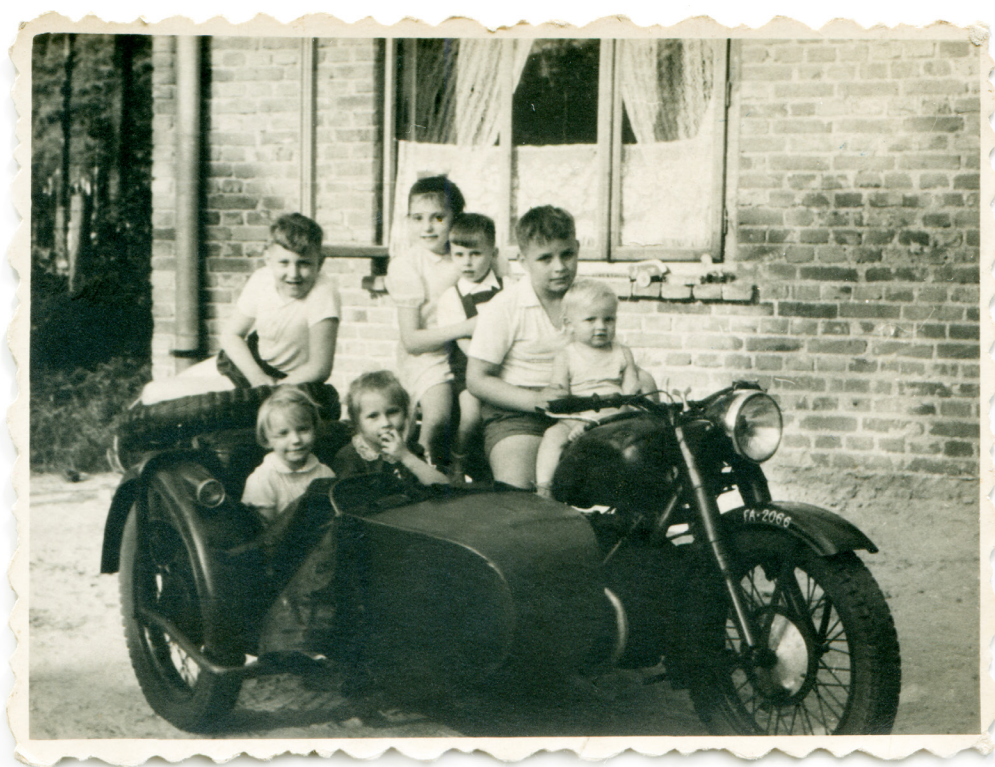
Special Features: We publish an occasional biography, as well as historical stories on memorable events, fads, antiques, fashions, sports, music, literature, entertainment, etc.
