Submission due date: 5/1/2021 On-sale date: 12/28/2021

April 2022

Colorful Escapes: Crocheters love their color. We are looking for any projects with variegated yarns, loads of color, striping or color blocking. And don't forget your scraps! Scrappy projects are a great way to use up bits of yarn and mix and match colors.

Splendid Kitchen: Kitchens need a bit of dressing up too. Think hot pads and mats, oven mitts, dishcloths, dish towels, oven towels, baskets or cylinder shapes to hold kitchen utensils, hanging baskets for fruit and vegetables, etc.

June 2022

Submission due date: 9/1/2021 On-sale date: 4/26/2022

Relaxing Retreat: Sometimes we forget about the place we go to retreat from the world and relax. Let's dress up the bedroom with rugs, pillows, throws and afghans. Also, doilies or coasters that would look nice on a nightstand, or even valances for the windows.

Waterfront Living: It's summer and the hot weather is upon us. It's time to chill by the water. We are looking for pillows and throws for lounging in the shade or sun, or that give a waterfront vibe to your living room. Also, picnic blankets, can cozies, picnic baskets or games for hanging out when the heat is upon us.

Electronic Media

Annie's operates on a Mac platform. Files must include ALL original files, images (linked, placed or supporting EPS files) and fonts.

Fonts

All fonts used are to be supplied or converted to outlines.

Images

Supply high-resolution images (300 dpi or better). Photoshop files, PDFs, TIFF, JPEG or EPS files are accepted. (Annie's does not accept responsibility for the quality of low-resolution files.)

Colors

All colors must be CMYK. Spot or Pantone colors will be converted to CMYK. Black needs to be 100% black.
