



2023 EDITORIAL CALENDAR

FEBRUARY 2023

SUBMISSION DUE DATE: 5/9/2022 ON-SALE DATE: 12/27/2022

- Wrapped in Love: Let's give our loved ones something to wrap up and keep warm in during this last bout of cold before spring. Shawls, wraps, afghans, throws and scarves would all be lovely. Don't forget your furry friends. They like a nice place to curl up on or hide in during the frigid months too!
- Work the Surface: How can you take a simple project and add some embellishment to it? We are looking for projects that feature embroidery, surface crochet, cross stitch, sashiko, appliqué and more. These surface techniques are a great way to add detail to crochet projects that otherwise use very simple stitches.



APRIL 2023

SUBMISSION DUE DATE: 7/8/2022 ON-SALE DATE: 2/21/2023

- Picture Perfect: Let us see how you can translate images to crochet using tapestry crochet, intarsia or corner-to-corner techniques. Use these techniques to put an animal face on a pillow, a landscape on a blanket, flowers on a hot pad or words along a table runner. Bring an image alive on a useful crochet item to add beauty to any room.
- Granny Stripes: Traditional granny squares are a series of three double crochet groups of stitches. Take that stitch pattern and create projects that use those groupings of stitches in different ways. This style lends itself well to scrappy projects and projects with stripes of colors. Think about different patterning involving the groups of stitches as well. Afghans, wall hangings, table runners, rugs, place mats, kitchen towels, chair protectors and more can easily utilize this stitch pattern in a new way.

JUNE 2023

SUBMISSION DUE DATE: 8/16/2022 ON-SALE DATE: 4/25/2023

- Making a Difference: Make projects designed for specific charities or to donate to hospitals and homeless shelters. Baby items and chemo caps are great projects to donate to hospitals. Hats, scarves and blankets are in high demand when the winter months hit for the homeless shelters. Pet beds and blankets for animal shelters, and comfort shawls and wraps or caddies for walkers and wheelchairs for people in assisted living are needed year-round. Let's put our craft to use and give the gift of comfort and love to someone in need.
- Stitch Samplers: Incorporate sections of different stitch patterns into your projects. It is summertime, so think about openwork stitches paired with patterning and color. Throws and afghans lend themselves well to sections of multiple stitches, but this style can easily be translated in slimmer sections to smaller projects like kitchen towels, table runners, place mats and even lightweight tops and wraps.

AUTUMN 2023

SUBMISSION DUE DATE: 10/7/2022 ON-SALE DATE: 7/4/2023

- Crocheted Organization: As we near the end of summer, it's time to take a moment and organize our spaces. Projects can include containers—such as baskets, trays, buckets or boxes—for storing different items, as well as more nonconventional storage, such as puffs packed with yarn or blankets, hanging pockets for small bathroom or kitchen supplies, or bags and pouches to store your crochet essentials.
- Summer's Glory: Bring the beauty of the outdoors inside and let summer inspire your designs. Pillows in natural shapes (like clouds, trees, flowers or mountains), blankets and throws with a landscape or floral scene, or even picnic blankets would be perfect. Also table settings and items good for outdoor use, or indoor table settings with a nod toward nature.
- Spiced Stitches: The jasmine stitch as a star anise, treble cluster stitches that look like green cardamom pods, bobbles that look like nutmeg seeds, and "coffee" bean stitches will be spotlighted in the designs. Projects use shades of brown, green, saffron and ginger.
- Cool Nights: Inspired by bonfires on chilly nights, these projects feature darker colors and are oversize. They're meant to be cozy and comforting.
- Sweater Weather: This one is all about being warm on chilly days. Think sweaters and cardigans with solid colors, stripes, Fair Isle, cables, etc.

WINTER 2023

SUBMISSION DUE DATE: 1/30/2023 ON-SALE DATE: 10/17/2023

- Quick & Easy Gifts: Use simple stitches to make smaller projects or items with heavier weights of yarn so that they can work up super-fast as last-minute gifts. This includes hats and mitts, scarves, lapghans, place settings, kitchen sets (trivets, dishcloth, kitchen towel), mug cozies, coasters and mug rugs. Dolls and amigurumi or pillow and blanket sets make great gifts for the kids.
- A Very Merry Tree: This holiday season let's spruce up the Christmas tree with some new dressings. This section will feature ornaments, garlands, tree skirts and toppers in a variety of styles. Gift bags for different types of presents are also a lovely way to dress up the area around your tree.
- Cozy Winter Fashion: Stay cozy and warm



SPRING 2024

SUBMISSION DUE DATE: 4/19/2023 ON-SALE DATE: 1/30/2024

- Spring Cleaning: Time to let our craft help us with the dirty work of spring cleaning! Create unique washcloths, dishcloths and kitchen towels in lovely spring colors. But don't stop there. There are so many things that can be made to help with cleaning every part of the house, such as scrubbies, dust mitts, reusable wet mop pads or blind lobsters. (Yes, they are a thing and quite handy for cleaning your blinds.)
- Scrap Afghans: While we are spring cleaning, let's look for ways to tidy up the stash as well. Combine your scraps to create afghans, throws, lapghans and baby blankets that are colorful and unique.
- Sweet Shop: This section is all about sweet
 projects in sweet colors, with movement
 and soft edges. Use whipped cream whites,
 macaron pastels, pale milk tea browns and
 croissant tans. Make projects in the style of
 sushi scarves that roll up into Danish pastries
 or rugelach; light sweaters, thin cardigans and
 hats that are worked in the round; and mug
 cozies and mug rugs.
- Watercolor Wonderland: Designs are made
 with a lot of movement and soft yarn. This
 section should be filled with projects made
 with variegated, heathered and ombré yarns.
 Stitch wall hangings, shawls, ponchos, throws,
 etc. Think of watercolor paintings and try to
 bring that softness into these projects.
