SPECIAL FEATURES



SUBMISSION DUE DATE: 7/01/2023 ON-SALE DATE: 12/26/2023

- Holidays Covered: New Year's Eve and Day, Valentine's Day, Presidents Day.
- Seasonal Story Examples: Winter activities: fun in the snow, cold-weather excursions and passing time indoors. First dates and romance.
- Featured Topic: Chores During the Winter Months—Helping the family with what needed to be done during the winter season.

APRIL 2024


SUBMISSION DUE DATE: 9/01/2023 ON-SALE DATE: 02/20/2024

- Holidays Covered: St. Patrick's Day, Easter, April Fools' Day, Mardi Gras.
- Seasonal Story Examples: Spring cleaning, planting the gardens (food or flowers), mowing for the first time, making repairs around the home, airing out the house, etc. Also memories of spring celebrations, such as Easter, First Communion, St. Patrick's Day and proms, as well as milestones such as bar mitzvahs, quinceañeras or 16th birthday debutante parties.
- Featured Topic: Hard Times—How did you help your family get by? Did you earn extra money, wear hand-me-down clothes or sleep two to a bed?
